Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a developmental disorder that causes problems with communication, social, verbal, and motor skills. No two people with autism are alike. A popular saying is, "If you've met one person with autism, you've met one person with autism." The United States Centers for Disease Control estimates one in 68 children have been disagnosed with ASD.

### How to Lower the Unemployment Rate

#### The Job Skills/Employment Program prepares and employs young adults.

Do you know what the unemployment rate is for people who are on the autism spectrum? Would you be surprised if I told you it was 90%? Would you be surprised if I told you that most of these individuals have graduated from high school, and some have even graduated from college? Doing the job is not the issue for many, it is getting over the hurdle of the interview. If you ask any of these people what they are doing with their lives, most will share with you the same thing. They are living in their parent's basement, doing very little, and are depressed. Wouldn't you be? This is unacceptable to us and the driving force behind our **Job Skills/Employment Program.** 

**The Job Skills Program** prepares people for the world of work. We do this by allowing our clients real world interactions in the business world. We work with as many local businesses as we can to give our clients the opportunity to experience a variety of skills on different job sites. Each program is specific to the needs of that person. Our community has embraced Living and Learning and the people who attend our programs. We have been able to create partnerships with Maybury Farm, Rebecca's Restaurant, Salon 170, The Village Workshop, Fresh Thyme Farmer's Market, The Farmer's Market, and First Centennial Title. These partnerships have allowed people with challenges more diversity in the skills they are learning on the job.

**The Employment Program** is for anyone who has autism or related challenges and is ready to seek employment. People in our program learn greetings, interviewing, appropriate behavior on the job, problem sovling, and essential social skills with colleagues and customers. We individualize every program to the specific needs of each person.

All of our clients are provided with a job coach who assists them in learning different skills and tasks specific to that job. Depending on what their individual needs are will determine when we fade out and allow them to be independent. Even when they are independent and are working without assitance, we visit the job site weekly to follow up with them and their manager. We make sure that each party knows we are always available to provide support when and if a new hurdle arises. Many of our clients, still to this day, will text us while at work with a question about social interactions.

Ken (name changed to protect privacy) is a young adult with autism. Before coming to Living and Learning, Ken was struggling with life, he was lonely, depressed and doing very little outside of his home. He enrolled into the Job Skills/Employment Program and began learning important interview, leadership, and job skills. He learned the importance of listening, proper body language, work manners, and communication skills. Ken began making friends with people at the center and was asked to be a mentor. With his new work skills mastered, Ken was offered a position at Fresh Thyme Farmer's Market in Canton. His mother has told us that this totally changed Ken's life. She said that Ken is happy and his self-esteem has soared.

### People Attend Our Programs from as Far Away as India!

We have families coming to Living and Learning who drive quite a distance for the services we provide. While most of our clients are from the Northville, Plymouth, Canton area we do get clients, who attend regularly, driving from South Lyon, Troy, Ypsilanti, and Allen Park. The reason for this is simple: Nothing like this exists where they live.

During a Saturday Night Hang-OUT over the summer, a woman peeked her head in the door to see what we were doing. She asked a lot of questions about what we did at the center and the type of people we work with there. She then asked if she could come back another time to visit with her cousins. When we met with her and her cousins they explained to us that they had a brother with autism living in India. We learned from them, that their brother's name was Pavan, he was a young adult with high functioning autism, living with their mother and father. At times the conversation became emotional as they explained to us how people with special needs were often treated horribly by others. They were afraid for his future and the limited choices that were available for him there. After several more meetings we met Pavan and his parents via SKYPE and created a solid plan for him to come to the United States with his mom. Pavan and his mother arrived in September. It's been wonderful having him attend our different programs and seeing him smile and grow.



I can't tell you how much Living and Learning has changed my son's life. To think just two years ago, he was sitting at home never leaving the house. You all gave him the confidence and tools to deal with his anxiety and provide him a safe and fun place he considers a home away from home now.

I'll never forget the time when I picked him up from hangout and he said, "Mom, it's a place I know that they like me." My heart melted. He has never felt so accepted anywhere else in his life. Thank you to all the wonderful staff and mentors. **JJ**


